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## **CURRICULUM VITAE**

# JUTTA MALNIC, nee Windel

Born 1924 in Berlin, Germany.

Childhood spent in Germany and Switzerland. My father served as German Consul General in Zurich until his death in 1934. The rest of the family returned to Berlin where they remained there during WWII.

**1943**, studied Philosophy, Literature, Art, Theatre and Film at Alexander v. Humboldt University in Berlin. Drafted into Work Force (Arbeitsdienst).

**1945-1948**, 2 years Photography course at Lette Verein, Berlin. Apprentice to prominent photo journalist H.H.Hartmann and working for Mauritius Picture Press Agency.

**1948**, Family migrated to Australia where our mother was born.

**1951**, married Sergei Malnic, an architectural student. whom I had met in Berlin and who followed us to Australia. We have two children, Nicola Julian, and five grandchildren.

**1949,** started a 20-year-long association with shipping company Orient Line (later amalgamated with P&O) as contracting on-board photographer on Sydney-to-Sydney cruises. Those years in the Pacific were an essential preparation for my later work documenting Kimberley Aboriginal culture and the intricate exchange system of the Kila Ring around Milne Bay, PNG.

**1975-1976**, worked on story research of an ancestral line of Tahitian chiefs, with their descendants, in Papeete. Excellent open line of information – but had to give up. Did not dare to counter a *cahuna* (Polynesian shaman woman).

1977-1978, seven one-day flights to the Antarctic, as on-board photographer.

**1979-1980**, Worked in shared authorship with Archeologist Elaine Godden on the book "*Rock Paintings of Aboriginal Australia*" as photographer.

### 1980-1984.

Documentation of *Kula Ring* exchanges and philosophy in Trobriands and around Milne Bay Province for book *KULA - Myth and Magic in the Trobriand Islands*. 15 visits to PNG.

**1989-1990**, working with film production company Sky Visuals on documentary "*Kula – Ring of Power*". Instigator, coordinator, ethnic and script adviser.

**1993**, "*Yorro Yorro – Spirit of the Kimberley*" book launches in Sydney, Perth, and with Aboriginal communities in the Kimberley.

**1993-1998**, work on *KULA* book research, text and publishing. Register Cowrie Books as publisher. *KULA* book launches at Goethe Institute and Australian Museum, Sydney.

1999-onwards, further research on book subjects.

**1949-1951** worked for Sunday Sun Newspaper, Sydney, as "regular casual" photographer for the social pages.

**1949**, exhibition of photographs in Sydney at fashion house *BORIS*, opened by Hal Missingham, director of Art Gallery of NSW.

1950 - 1969, worked for Orient Lines of Australia, first D&P, then contracted as on-board photographer (with three assistants) on 72 Sydney-Sydney Pacific cruises.
